Quality

Your library needs content, but not just any content. You must be sure that your budget is being spent on the highest quality content. For the second year running, Cambridge Journals hit a new level of success in the Thomson Reuters Journals Citation Reports (JCR).

Both *Behavioral and Brain Sciences* and *International Organization* are ranked as number 1 in their categories and *Behavioral and Brain Sciences* came top of all 1,865 journals indexed in the Social Science Citation Index (SSCI).

Over a quarter of Cambridge journals sit within the top 10 of their categories when ranked by Impact Factor. Eleven of our journals are placed in the top 5 in their categories.

In the latest JCR rankings Cambridge journals outperformed their competitors with an average increase in Impact Factor of 13.2% against an average of 3.6% for the journals within their subject categories. Cambridge's Humanities and Social Science journals averaged an increase of 16% and the Science, Technology and Medicine journals increased by 11.3% whereas the average increase over all categories was only 3.8%.

In total, almost two-thirds of Cambridge journals that are indexed in the JCR demonstrated an increase in their Impact Factor.
